- **SSH research is providing the insights for future solutions.** Funding the field of Socio-Economic Sciences and the Humanities (SSH) contributes to an in-depth, shared understanding of the complex and interrelated socio-economic challenges facing Europe and the rest of the world. The European Commission has supported SSH research over the last four consecutive framework programmes, and has sealed this commitment by dedicating a specific theme to SSH research under the 7th Framework Programme (FP7). - Excellence in marine and maritime research and in particular improved integration between all the relevant scientific disciplines, are needed to address complex sea-related issues in the framework of the EU maritime policy. This is an essential objective of the European Commission which decided to launch joint calls under FP7 in 2009-2010 on major research topics requiring a cross-thematic approach. **The ocean of tomorrow call** is the first Commission initiative to implement this commitment. - The European Commission sets **new information society challenges: Becoming literate in new media**. Following a call from the European Parliament, has adopted (following a call from the European Parliament) policy guidelines calling on EU countries and industry to promote media literacy across Europe through activities that help people access, understand and critically evaluate all media they are exposed to, like TV and film, radio, music, print media, the internet and digital communication technologies. - **Converging Research achievements and policy.** The SSH Programme addresses research issues which are "problem oriented" and "policy relevant". Dissemination of academic work at EU-level is of utmost importance. Researchers involved in the Framework Programme are encouraged to think about "knowledge transfer", "knowledge into use" and how "science meets policy" and are constantly invited to produce policy briefs which alert targeted audiences on new knowledge European added value and policy messages from their EU funded research projects. - The European Commission adopted a Decision **to allow the optional use of flat rates** to cover subsistence costs on FP7 projects. The note sets out the calculation of the daily subsistence allowance, the calculation of the duration, as well as information on reimbursement and audits. The rates for daily subsistence and accommodation per country are also listed. These flat rates are optional for those beneficiaries who would find it a simplification to use this method. - The Faroe Islands are expected to formally associate to FP7 on of 1 January 2010. Advanced notification is provided in the Guides for Applicants for the current set of calls for proposals: "Note that the association agreement between the EC and the Faroe Islands is expected to become provisionally applicable as of 1 January 2010. Other countries may become associated during the course of FP7."
